Survey Report

Earlier in the year, members were given the opportunity to have their say about the improvements/changes they would like to see at the club. Below is a summary of the major points from the survey. See the full report on the noticeboard for more details.

Number of responses: 37.5% of the club membership responded. **Question 1**:

Changes to Clubhouse: About 76% of those who responded would like to see some upgrading of the clubhouse, including the kitchen area, external access to toilets and expanding the clubhouse by adding a usable outside space at the end of the clubhouse

Question 2:

Changes to outside the clubhouse: the most common responses were in relation to providing more protected areas outside including usable space at the end of the clubhouse.

Question 3:

Changes to playing areas and surrounds: There was no one clear response for the question

Question 4:

Additional Lawn: The most common responses were that we need more members to cover on-going costs and that we can't afford it on present membership numbers

Action resulting from the survey

- additional storage has been provided to make the clubhouse more tidy
- a new brush and pan with a long handle is now available
- a stick vacuum has been provided
- the Committee is in the process of applying for grants to purchase new balls
- a concept plan for upgrading the clubhouse has been developed. More details on page 3.

Concept Plan for upgrading the Clubhouse

The concept plan is on display in the clubhouse. The plan is designed as a 3-stage process

Stage 1: upgrading the kitchen area and putting a sliding door on the eastern end of the clubhouse

Stage 2: paving/decking the outside area from the sliding door

Stage 3: building new toilets at the rear of the clubhouse and converting the inside toilet space into an office and storage area

Over the coming months, the Committee will be developing submissions for funding grants to assist with redevelopment of the clubhouse.


Changes to notification of housekeeping
