The Festive Season

Season's greetings to all our readers!



By the time you read this Santa may already have visited. We hope his visit brought pleasure to you and your family.

Sports equipment has always proved a popular gift. As early as 1909 (December 2nd) in the Launceston Examiner *M'Kay*, *Sampson & McKinlay* advised that croquet sets at 3s/6d could be delivered on Christmas Eve! (Younger readers may need to ask older club members to translate 3s/6d into \$.¢)

It is traditional for most Tasmanian croquet clubs to take a break during the end of December with competitive play taking second place to Christmas celebrations, but as soon as the January arrives, off we go again.

In the same year as the earlier Examiner advert, at the other end of the state the Hobart Mercury reported (December 24th 1909) that

"Croquet tournaments are being arranged, and will be played in January on the lawns of the New Town Croquet Club. It will be remembered that very successful tournaments were played last season.' The entries already to hand show that the forthcoming competitions will be equally successful."

2013 starts off not at New Town but at Sandy Bay with the All-grades doubles (the HiLo) from January $4^{th} - 6^{th}$.

At this time of year the Christmas/New Year carnivals travel around the state. filled today with cycling, foot races and wood chopping events. It was not always the case. As early as 1864 the Mercury advised the Eastern Shore Boxing Day carnival which included Croquet.

The were no cycle races – for until that year (1864 in Paris) bicycles had no pedals, but were propelled by foot – the velocipede.

Continuing with the historical theme, December now sees Leavers Dinners and Schoolies weeks. In 1867 Horton College in Ross presented prizes for the Christmas Examinations with subjects including Latin, Greek, Euclid, English History, Roman History and Scripture. The afternoon was spent on the College lawn, where three croquet sets were in constant requisition until near tea time. Then tho dining hall was well filled and became a lively scene. It had been decorated by the students, and provided by the ladies of the establishment.

How times have changed. There were no limousines, no under-age drinking, and no arrests reported!

Patsy Paine and Lee Turner report that the 2012 Northern Golf Croquet Pennants have been completed with a minimum of fuss with six teams competing over 5 rounds. There was a weekend Sunday pennant, and a separate inaugural mid week pennant. The midweek pennant was played at the NTasCC in order to free up club lawns for social play, while the Sunday pennant was played on club home venues.

41 players took part with a total of 213 games being contested in the weekend pennant. East Launceston came out on top.

Apart from one round being adversely affected by the weather, it was a pretty successful season all round with no recommended changes to the format. Women's and Men's Medals

Two more games had to be played before Ricki was declared the winner.

Ten players contested the Men's Medal with the top two in each Block playing off in the finals. Ian Smith played brilliant croquet to be undefeated in his section with Mick Wood runner-up. Ian Scott of the St. Leonards Club caused an upset in the 2nd Block defeating Rob McAdam by 1 hoop after full time. McAdam then played Bob Bye in the final game of the block and redeemed himself with a solid win to come a close second to Bob and reach the semi - finals.

Bob Bye played excellent croquet against Mick Wood in one semi - final winning 26 - 0 and Rob McAdam was in outstanding form in the other semi to comfortably defeat Ian Smith 26 -15.

The final between McAdam and Bye was of a high standard with both players making rare errors. The end score of 26 - 15 in favour of Bob Bye did not reflect the closeness of the final until a good break at the end secured the victory.
