## **NORTHERN TASMANIA CROQUET CENTRE REPORT**

An insight to the Northern Tasmania Croquet Centre role in the North

The Centre Committee was set up to control centre activities, organise maintenance of the lawns, encourage and give the public the opportunity to play croquet. At the same time the St Leonards Club was formed as a home club at the centre and was instrumental in assisting with the ground work. The committee consists of representatives from the East Launceston and St Leonards clubs and volunteers are sought from all clubs in the North and other users e.g. School for Seniors. It was agreed that the centre committee organise all events at the centre with St Leonards organising club activities.

St Leonards club have at least 4 Lawns to play on their Wednesday Club Day but are able to use lawns on any day. The School for Seniors have 2 sessions on Mondays with 40+ members playing 4 Ball and Golf Croquet. They also patronise the Thursday night twilight session. There are three disabled sessions weekly. School groups are welcome and Newstead College recently attended 2 sessions with 30 students playing. A come and try day organised by the Active Launceston with 8 participants, resulting in four participants making arrangements to play again.

This year the Golf Croquet Pennants were organised by the N.R.C.C. committee with 3 sections. East Launceston won all three groups with good games in all matches. The Novice Association event was staged with Lyn Farrell (East Launceston Club) winning from Joan Williams and Helen Larner (St Leonards Club). The Tasmania Golf Croquet Championship was organised with 29 participants over 3 days; there was positive feedback for this event with lots of Golf Croquet played in excellent weather. The Mayoral Challenge was a great success with four Mayors in the North vying to play the challenging Mayor from Meander Valley who won the crown in a very close game from the Dorset Mayor.

The Easter Gala has been played again this year. Entries were received from South Australia,

Victoria, New South Wales and local players. The lack of entries from the South is disappointing. Light Lunch was served at a cost. The organisers are questioning whether Easter is a good time for this event and would like to have feedback/comments.

Overall it has been a busy two months and volunteers who have assisted in any way are sincerely thanked.

The other members of the team, from the Kingston Club, were Sue Beattie, Rob McAdam, Elaine Roomes and Bob Beattie as reserve, supporter and a wonderful "gopher". The team played Association Croquet against the other states, vying for the coveted Eire Cup.

Each test consisted of four doubles in the morning, followed by sixteen singles. The conditions were not easy, with tight Quadway hoops, wind, rain, heat and varying lawn speeds. Despite this, Tasmania did the best they have done for over thirty years.

On the first day of the five tests, the team played the reigning champions NSW and gave them a big fright. Tasmania equalled NSW on games but was pipped on points. All of a sudden the other states started taking Tasmania seriously.

The whole team acquitted themselves very well in all tests and the final day saw Tasmania beating Queensland, thirteen games to seven.

The team returned home with pride and renewed enthusiasm to practice, learn, apply and win the Eire Cup in 2017, when it will be held here in Tasmania.
