Practice Sessions

Practice for the Gold Medal will be from 11am – 4pm on Tuesday 5th March.

Singles practice will be on Friday afternoon 1-5pm on 8 March at all venues (Sandy Bay only after Gold+Silver Medals are complete).

Practice for the Eire Cup is by arrangement.

An informal Welcome BBQ is on at Sandy Bay from 4pm on Friday 8 March – no booking required, but cash only.

You can also register at your venue before play on Sat 9 March.

Eire Cup Team Reception

A function to introduce State Teams will be held from 1800 on Tuesday 12 March at Government House. This is by invitation, through your Team Manager.

Presentation Dinner

The Eire Cup Presentation Dinner will be held at Clarence Cricket Pavilion, Clarence on the Bay at Kangaroo Bay, commencing at 6:30 for 7pm on Sunday 17 March following completion of the Eire Cup. All welcome – cost is \$75/person, which includes the first drink. Venues

Hobart has 4 clubs with a total of 10 lawns. Two extra lawn will be used at the Rosny Bowls Club.

For the Eire Cup SBCC and KCC will make one venue of two lawns each, NTCC and SBCC will make a venue (3 lawns and 1 lawn resp.). ESCC and RBC will make one venue (2 lawns each).

CONDITIONS OF PLAY

Hobart 2024

General

1. All events will be played under the Laws of Association Croquet, Seventh Edition amended Feb 2021 & adopted by Croquet Australia on 1 July 2021; and the Australian Tournament Regulations, amended on 15 Feb 2023, including the WCF Refereeing Regulations.
2. All competitors who have not already provided an address, phone number and/or email address at which messages can reach them during the events should provide this information during registration.
3. Tournament Headquarters is Sandy Bay CC.
4. Courts may be available for practice from 7:30am to 7.50am each day, when hoops may only be run in a controlled fashion, and after the completion of play for the day (at the discretion of Venue Managers).
5. Atkins Quadway Hoops will be used in all events. As per ACA Tournament Regulation 15.6.1, hoops will be set as near as possible to:
 - (a) largest ball on court plus a clearance of 1/32" for the Gold & Silver Medals. If conditions are considered "easy" (eg soft ground), this clearance may be reduced to a minimum of 1/64" if the TR & TM jointly agree that doing so is both practical and will not require the imposition of time limits that would otherwise have been unnecessary;
 - (b) 3 11/16" with an upward tolerance of zero and a downward tolerance of 1/32" for the Singles and the Eire Cup, except that the Men's Semi-Finals & Final will be set to largest ball on court plus a clearance of 1/32" since 12 players have a dgrade of 2100 or better:
 - (c) Law 38.2 applies to all these events.
6. Dawson International Mark 2 balls will be used.
7. Courts will be allocated by the Venue Manager and games will generally be double banked.
8. A 5 minute warm up period will be permitted before a player's first game of the day when hoops may only be run in a controlled fashion. There will be a 5 minute warm-up before all Eire Cup games. This is all subject to the tournament schedule.
9. Play shall commence at **8.00 am** sharp unless the Tournament Manager decides otherwise. Players are requested to be at their designated court before their scheduled starting time for each match.
10. Referees are Supervising.
11. Players are allowed a break of up to 10 minutes between matches and a lunch break of up to 30 minutes. No break is allowed between games of multiple game matches. The Tournament & Venue Managers will ensure games go on expeditiously to enable completion of the scheduled program.
12. Players must inform the Venue Manager should they wish to leave the venue for any reason.
13. Players will wear foot wear which will not mark the court and provides adequate protection for themselves both on and off the court; and neat, clean attire which the Tournament or Venue Manager judges will not cause significant offence to others. A player in unsuitable clothing or foot wear will be given the opportunity to dress appropriately or will not be permitted to participate in the event.
14. The Tournament/Venue Managers will decide whether play in any match should continue if the weather deteriorates.
15. The Tournament Manager, in consultation with the representative of Croquet Australia, may make any alterations to the program, draw and other arrangements as are necessary in order to complete the tournament in the time available. If available, lights may be used at the Tournament or Venue Manager's discretion if required to achieve the schedule.
16. Special damage may be repaired in accordance with Law 37.3.
17. Players' attention is drawn to Law 56 regarding Expedition in Play.
18. The Australian Handicapping System is used for this Tournament. Players must ensure that they have their handicap cards with them and present them to the authorised person before playing. The Tournament Handicapper may amend a player's handicap before the commencement of play where there is a significant inconsistency between players of similar world ranking grade. Handicap changes take effect immediately after completion of any game in which players pass a trigger point (in accordance with the updated Handicapping Regulations published on the ACA Website on 145 March 2010, reviewed Sept 2021).
19. An appeals committee comprising the Tournament Manager, the Tournament Referee and a member of the ACA Board (or nominated representative) shall determine any matters that are in dispute during the course of the tournament.
20. Winners of trophies are to obtain a quote for engraving their details on the trophy and submit this to the Administrative Officer of Croquet Australia for approval before proceeding with engraving. If an overseas player wins an event, any perpetual trophy shall remain in Australia in the ACA's custody.

AUSTRALIAN AC GOLD AND SILVER MEDALS

All games to be played at Sandy Bay CC

In accordance with ACA Tournament Regulation 30:

- the draw is seeded by World Ranking at 20 Feb 2024
- the format is a double round robin of single games
- players will toss a coin to determine the choice of the lead or balls in terms of Law 10 for games in the first round
- for second round games between the same opponents, the loser of the toss in the first round game is deemed to have won the toss for the second round game.
- on Days 1 and 2 (Wednesday and Thursday) each player has 4 games, and on Day 3 (Friday) each player has 2 games, plus any play-off game(s) required.
- all games will be untimed, but subject to ACA Tournament Regulation 16.1

2024 Men's/Women's Singles

2. These draws were conducted by the ACA Tournament Committee in conjunction with the Events and AC Selection Committees using the ACA Seeding and Draw procedures and the World Ranking List at 20 Feb 2024.
3. The format is single life knockout, with all matches being best of three games, except for the Men's final which will be Bo5 provided that all of day 4 is free for this match.
4. Players having a bye in the first round can have a 15 minute warm up with four balls before playing their first game (unless both players had byes in the first round, in which case a 5 minute warm up with 2 balls each is permitted).
5. Each best of three shall have a cumulative time limit of 7.5 hours with individual game time limits of 2.75, 2.5 and 2.25 hours plus Reg.16.3.1. Each best of five shall have a cumulative time limit of 12 hours with individual game time limits of 2.75, 2.5, 2.25, 2.25 and 2.25 hours plus Reg. 16.3.1. Time not used in games shall be added to subsequent games. Players are responsible for their own time clocks.
6. If time is called in any game and play continues in terms of Regulation 16.3.1, the extra time to complete the game shall be excluded from the above-mentioned time limits.
7. No player shall be required to play more than 12 hours or 6 games in one day.
8. Alternative venues may be used if necessary.
9. Men's: First round losers proceed to the Plate. An XYWZ shall be played at the round of 16. Losers in the round of 16 play in the Y event. Losers in the first round of the Y play in the W event. Losers of the quarter-finals play in the Z event. Losers of X semi-finals play off for 3 – 4. Losers in YWZ semi-finals stop playing.
10. Women's: First round losers proceed to the Plate. An XYWZ shall be played at the round of 16. Losers in the round of 16 play in the Y event. Losers in the first round of the Y play in the W event. Losers of the quarter-finals play in the Z event. Losers of X semi-finals play off for 3 – 4. Losers in YWZ semi-finals stop playing.

Plate Events

11. Players who may enter the Plate events are as follows:
 - a. Men or Women knocked out in round 1 of the main event; plus
 - b. Players who entered the Plate only.
12. Depending on final numbers, the Men's Plate will be a block of 8 playing a round robin of single games, each player having 7 games. This will be followed by single game semi-finals and a final. The Women's Plate will be a block of 8 playing a round robin of single games, each player having 7 games. This will be followed by single game semi-finals and a final.
13. The Plate will start immediately that players (and courts) become available. However this is subject to change at the discretion of the Tournament Manager.
14. Plate games have a time limit of 2.5 hours.

2024 Eire Cup Conditions of Play

1. On the day scheduled for any match
 - a) The names of the players & order of play, including doubles pairings, are to be notified by the Captain or Vice Captain to the Venue Manager or Assistant Venue Manager at least 20 minutes before the commencement of each match. In each match only four men players and four women players may be selected to play singles but the players selected to play doubles may be different members of the team from those playing singles. The order of play for singles games is to be in accordance with world rankings as at 20 February 2024. Doubles teams are not required to conform to world rankings;
 - b) Individual members of teams may be varied for each separate match. Apart from the arrangements permitted above, individual members of a team may not be varied during a match, unless a player is incapacitated by sickness or accident. In such event, a reserve player may fill his or her place in the team for any game not already commenced in such match except for the second round of singles. Such substitution must be reported to the Captain of the opposing team and be sanctioned by the Venue Manager in consultation with the Venue Referee. The second round of singles must be played with the same players who played in the first round of singles of that match. If a player is not available for the start of the second singles game in a match then a forfeit will be awarded. If the game is started but is unable to be completed then it will be conceded.
2. Each team is entitled to nominate one or more players, any of whom may, prior to the start of the match act as a substitute for a player if the nominated reserve is not available. If the occasion arises that no substitute is available, a reasonable time will be allowed to obtain a substitute, and the team schedule is adjusted accordingly. If the team concerned is unable to nominate a substitute within the given time, the singles game(s) for that player is forfeited (26-0).
3. A player, once replaced by a reserve or substitute, cannot play again that day, but may play again on subsequent days.
4. Each team plays every other team once. A match consists of twenty games, four mixed doubles and sixteen singles. Mixed doubles will be played first. The States may pair any man and women player together and determine which of their four pairs are to be 1,2,3,4. Following the mixed doubles singles are played women versus women and men versus men.
5. Should a team be unable to complete the series of matches, scores for and against that team are deleted from all results.
6. The team winning a match is the team that wins the most games, but:
 - a) If games are equal, the team that wins most net points.
 - b) If scores are still equal, the match is a tie and each team scores half (1/2) a point.
 - c) The team winning the match scores one (1) point.
7. The winner of the Interstate Cup is the team scoring the greatest number of matches.
 - a) If matches are equal, the team scoring the greatest number of games during the series.
 - b) If games are equal, the team scoring the greatest number of net points in the series.
 - c) If the number of net points in the series is equal, the winner is decided by the result of the match already played between the teams involved in the tie.
 - d) If (c) was a tie, the trophy is shared.
