## ASSOCIATION CROQUET PENNANT RULES SUMMER PENNANT SEASON 2025

The object of this Summer Pennant is to provide all those wanting to participate in competitive play the best opportunity to do so.

This Pennant will consist of Divisions 2 and 3 only.

Play will be club based, level and use handicap cards.

The following rules have been designed to accommodate the above and like last pennant rely heavily on a **spirit of cooperation between clubs**, with clubs having surplus players being prepared to allow their members to make up teams with other clubs, if necessary.

### 1. Date

The season will start on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> January 2025 and will run for 9 weeks (with a break of one week for the Openshaw Tournament) finishing on 20<sup>th</sup> March 2025.

- Division 2 play Thursdays
- Division 3 play Tuesdays

### 2. Clubs

Only affiliated clubs may enter teams for the Pennant

### 3. Laws

Matches shall be played under the Laws of Croquet as adopted by the Tasmanian Croquet Association (TCA); additionally

- (a) Players may have a 5-minute warm-up at the beginning of each game.
- (b) Double banking rules as in the Laws Book will apply.

### 4. Entries

- (a) The closing date for entries will be Friday 27<sup>th</sup> December 2024.  
As appropriate, late entries may be accepted at the Manager's discretion.
- (b) The Pennant Committee shall determine the time frame for the Competition and days of play. **If times are not suitable to teams, they are encouraged to reschedule matches in a spirit of co-operation.** All matches are to be played prior to the conclusion of the Pennant season. The Pennant Committee will have the final decision on this matter.

### 5. Equipment and Referee

- (a) The Home club will provide Clocks, Regulation Pegs, Hoops, Flags and Corner Pegs, Approved Balls and arrange for a Referee, if possible.
- (b) The hoops will be set at  $3\frac{11}{16}$  inches  $\pm \frac{1}{32}$ <sup>nd</sup> for both divisions.

## 6. Players

- (a) Every player must be a full financial member of an affiliated Club of the TCA.
- (b) Players who are a member of two or more affiliated Clubs must nominate the club they will represent.
- (c) A team which is short of players, by any amount, can be made complete by accepting players from another club, and should be from clubs which have an excess of players or not enough players to form a regular team in their own right. They should not, where possible, be players who normally occupy a position in a team's starting line-up.
- (d) While movement of players between clubs, to fill in gaps, is tolerated, the person borrowed should, where possible, be of similar standard to others who fill that team position in other teams. (Example: If a "Position 4" person is needed to fill a team, a person who normally plays in another team as a "Position 1" should not be borrowed.
- (e) Players whose handicap is changed during the Pennant Season may continue to play in the same team, but on their revised handicap for the purpose of determining the order of singles play and for use of handicap cards.
- (f) There is no limit to the number of times a player in Division 3 may play in Division 2
- (g) If a player's handicap increases, they will be eligible to play in a lower Division.
- (h) Players who have a bye may play in another team in place of a similarly handicapped player if that team is unable to field a side.
- (i) Players filling in as substitutes can fill in for more than one team.
- (j) Players must wear appropriate sportswear or club uniform and flat soled shoes.
- (k) Mentors are allowed for players in Division 3
- (l) Mentors are permitted on the lawn during play to provide advice **ONLY**, when asked by the mentored **BUT must NOT touch the balls or demonstrate how to hold the mallet.**  
**Mentors should always advise expeditiously to ensure play continues in an appropriate manner and time frame.**

## 7. Teams

Teams are to comprise of 4 or more players by applying the options outlined under "Players" above

## 8. Matches

- (a) Full sized lawns shall be used.
- (b) Each match shall consist of two doubles and four singles.
- (c) Rules of Advanced level play apply to all games.
- (d) Handicap cards will be used.
- (e) The Handicap Ranges are:

Division 2	6 - 20
Division 3	14 - 20
- (f) The order of play for singles games will be determined by a player's handicap. Co-ordinators/captains will list their players in order of play from the lowest to the

highest handicap player. Where there is an equality of handicap between players, the co-ordinator/captain may choose to list those players in his/her preferred order of play.

- (g) Double banking will be used for both singles and doubles games.
- (h) If a team forfeits a match, full points are awarded to the opposing team.
- (i) If a team forfeits a game within a match, the score shall be 26-0 to the opposing team.

## **9. Times**

- (a) The time for commencement of play will be as soon after **10.00am** as practical given the vagaries of traffic. If all players and referees are ready before this time games could start as early as possible.
- (b) Playing time shall be 2 ½ hours per game for both singles and doubles games and play should continue until all games have been played, subject to Tournament Regulation 16.3.
- (c) Afternoon play shall commence no later than 1.30 pm.
- (d) In all games the time shall be kept by a clock or timer, which shall be available for inspection by all players.
- (e) In the event of a player not being ready to commence play in any game within 30 minutes of the time appointed for commencement, the opposing team has the option of claiming the game but see Law 40(b) re doubles play. If such a claim is made, the defaulting team shall be deemed to have lost the game, and the score shall be 26-0 to the opposing team. If, due to traffic delays a match is unable to start on time, a phone call to the club will suffice to rearrange the start times to a time negotiated by the team co-ordinators/captains.

## **10. Order of Play**

- (a) The doubles games will be played in the morning, and the singles games will be played in the afternoon.
- (b) Ten minutes before the match is due to commence, the opposing co-ordinators/captains shall provide to each other a listing of the games in which their members will play.

## **11. The Toss**

- (a) The lawn to be used is decided by the home team.
- (b) The toss for lead or balls shall be decided separately for each game.

## **12. Adverse Weather**

- (a) A player may appeal against adverse playing conditions. The co-ordinators/captains of the two teams may agree to suspend play due to adverse conditions, which may endanger health and well-being of a player and/or make the lawns unplayable. Co-ordinators/captains should be aware of the TCA Adverse Weather Policy.
- (b) In the event of the co-ordinators/captains being unable to agree, play shall cease.

- (c) If play is unable to continue, the matches shall be pegged down and completed as soon as possible at a convenient date to be fixed. The Home co-ordinator/captain shall advise the Pennant Manager within two days, the date the match will be played.
- (d) If play had not commenced in any game, the composition of either or both teams may, if necessary, be varied by the teams concerned.

### 13. Results

- (a) Games
  - (i) In any game the winner shall be the player or side scoring the greater number of points.
  - (ii) If at the expiration of the appointed time the points in an unfinished game are equal, play shall continue until one side scores an additional point. (Reg. 16.3)
  - (iii) In the event of an accident or unexpected sickness causing a player to forfeit a game, their score shall be retained, and the opponent score shall advance to 26.
- (b) Matches
  - (i) In any match the winning team shall be the one scoring the greater number of games.
  - (ii) If games are equal the winning team shall be the one scoring the greater number of hoop points.
  - (iii) If games and hoop points are equal the result shall be declared a draw.
- (c) Pennant Competition
  - (i) All teams are eligible to win a Pennant.
  - (ii) In each division the winning team shall be the one scoring the greatest number of matches,
  - (iii) If matches be equal, then the aggregate games shall count.
  - (iv) If games be equal, then the aggregate points shall count.
  - (v) In the event of teams having equal scores of matches, games, and hoop points at the end of the series, there shall be further matches played between these teams which shall be scored as above to determine the final result of the series.
  - (vi) In the event of a team retiring at any time from the Pennant Competition, all scores gained for and against that team shall not be counted.

### 14. Notification of Results

- (a) The Co-ordinator/captain of the Home Team shall be responsible for reporting the results of each match to the Pennant Manager.
- (b) **Home Team Co-ordinators/Captains must forward the results to the Pennant Manager at the conclusion of the day's play. It is preferred that this be done by scanning a completed result sheet, (or taking a photo) and sending it to [southernascroquetpennant@gmail.com](mailto:southernascroquetpennant@gmail.com)**

**15. Protests**

- (a) Any protest must be in writing and received by the Pennant Manager (at [southerntascroquetpennant@gmail.com](mailto:southerntascroquetpennant@gmail.com) ) within three (3) days of the completion of the match to which the protest refers.
- (b) Protests will be considered by the Pennant Manager, the Pennant Referee, and a nominee of the TCA Executive.

**17. Pennant Manager**

The Pennant Manager shall –

- (a) On receipt of entries, prepare the draw.
- (b) Forward a copy of the draw to each Club at least 1 week prior to the commencement of the Pennant.
- (c) Ensure that home and away games are played evenly, where possible.
- (d) Forward a report on the competition to the TCA Secretary as soon as possible after the completion of the Roster

**18. Queries**

Any questions arising out of these Rules shall be addressed by the Pennant Manager (Margaret Pinkard 0405181121) and Pennant Referee (Lizzie Bassett 0409799462).

**19. Fees**

- (a) All visiting players will pay Lawn Fees of \$6 for each Pennant Day.
- (b) Teams will be charged \$25 per entry, by TCA.

**20. Health and Safety – COVID 19**

Players whose health is compromised shall not play.
