Update on our Equipment

- 1. <u>The Balls:</u> The original Dawson ball recipe went out of production following changes to Australian product regulations which banned one of the substances used. Testing continues to recreate a recipe that meets the specification. The WCF have been advised that there has been some success. We hope these balls will be available soon.

 We considered purchasing balls from another producer, but have decided to wait until the Dawson Balls are available
- 2. <u>New Containers for GC Clips:</u> We now have 4 divided containers two for primary colours and two for secondary colours with each compartment having six clips. These will enable users to quickly see if any clips are missing.
 - * We encourage social players to use the clips to enable you to more easily keep score, as well as providing some experience in using them if/when you play in any competitions or pennant.
- 3. <u>Lawn Broom:</u> We are purchasing a new Lawn Broom which will be easier to use to brush away the dew in the mornings. It is important the dew is swept away as playing on a very "dewier" lawn can encourage the establishment of diseases/viruses.
