Clubhouse Renovations


Thank you to a small group of members who have installed and painted the cladding on the eastern end of the clubhouse.

Playing by the rules: Running a Hoop

A ball begins to run a hoop when any part of it first emerges from the back (non-playing side) of the hoop and finishes doing so when the whole of it finally enters the front (playing side) of the hoop, provided that it does not roll back past this point later in the stroke.


