Members' Survey



The Executive Committee would like to thank all members who completed the survey. Over the last few months, the committee has been focused on collating and writing a comprehensive report, which is now complete.

Summary of the Report:

- A survey was conducted amongst Members of Kingston Croquet Club (KCC) in June 2022, designed to help the Club plan for the future. This was done through a written questionnaire to all Members and designed and administered by two KCC Executive Committee Members with experience in this work.
- 2. Three quarters of all members responded. This is an excellent rate, which reflects the high rate of member interest in the future of the Club. The researchers believe the findings can be treated as representative of all KCC Members.
- 3. Four out of five KCC Members are aged over 65 years. There are few Members in the 21 to 65 age group. There is a small cohort of Junior Members.
- 4. The Club has a stable and relatively long serving membership base with low attrition.
- 5. Overall Members are happy with Club management and facilities; however there some issues raised by a significant number of KCC members which warrant action (see point 9).
- 6. Half the members play golf croquet only; Slightly over 1/3 play both Golf and Association. 10 % of Members play Association only. Overall, 90% of Members play Golf croquet; about half play Association, indicating a majority preference for Golf croquet.
- 7. Two thirds of members claim to play croquet 2 or 3 times per week; one quarter play once per week. This is a high activity rate and highlights the importance of optimizing lawn utilization, particularly when there are two alternative forms of the game.
- 8. A large majority of Members think the cost of playing croquet is 'about right'. A few would pay more. There is general awareness of the impact of inflation and benefit of additional members and task volunteering to contain costs.
- 9. Two thirds of Members think Club facilities are 'good'; A quarter think they are 'average/reasonable'. This was qualified with a substantial number of opinions and suggestions. These were centred around:
 - a. the condition of the access driveway and parking area
 - b. the condition and amenity of the clubhouse
 - c. the need for additional playing lawns
 - d. utilization of the existing lawns.
 - e. Importantly, many comments expressed concerns about the toilets
- 10. Social events are well regarded by Members but have been affected by covid and self confessed apathy by a few.
- 11. All requests, suggestions and questions will be addressed either collectively or individually and responded to.
- 12. The researchers believe the future of Kingston Croquet Club will be significantly underpinned by actions taken in response to the above issues (point 9).
- 13. The earlier 2019 survey, mentioned in the introduction, indicated the club needed a long term plan. As the club is entering a new stage in its development it will be recommended that a business plan, that includes a vision statement, a mission statement, a value statement, detailed objectives and anticipated outputs and outcomes be undertaken, involving all members.

Postscript to the Survey Report

The sub-committee for the survey met at the weekend and has provided this update for all members.

Survey Update

(dated 16th October 2022)

Priorities – (No cost)

- Membership and lawn utilisation
- Lawns maintaining present lawns and addressing current issues
- Clubhouse including toilets low-cost alternatives
- · Feasibility study into additional playing lawns

Additional - medium and longer term and requiring outside funding

- New toilets in combination with outdoor covered area
- Car Park exploring options to address slippery slope
- Additional lawns contingent on feasibility study

A working group has been established to develop a strategic plan which includes

- A Vision statement that is aspirational, enduring, sustainable and realistic
- A Mission statement to develop 'what, why, how and when'
